### The Flashlight

At the end of the Book of Numbers, we encounter the list of 42 encampments during the Israelites' 40 year journey through the desert. Scholars ask: "Why does the Torah devote so many lines to each of the encampments? Afterall, we would never visit them again, why are there so many details, like their names, included?"

Our Rabbis explain that the 42 encampments are actually 42 independent journeys. Each step enabled the next. Like the rungs on a ladder, without the lower rung, we could not climb higher or distance ourselves from the dangers of Egypt.

The Hebrew word for Egypt is "Mitzrayim." The root word is familiar to us. It is like the Yiddish word "tzoris" – problems. Leaving Mitzrayim can be understood literally as travelling away "from our worries."

This is a great lesson for the "Flashlight." Each person is encumbered by their own "mini-Egypt." Everyone has difficulties, their own "tzoris." Just as the ancient Israelites used incremental steps to distance themselves from Egypt... so too can we grasp the flashlight and see within ourselves the anxieties and conflicts that we can leave behind – like sites in our rearview mirror.

Each step distances us a bit more from our personal "little Egypt" and draws us closer to our very own promised land. Each stage represents an essential chapter in our life's documentary. Each stage on our journey we can glean invaluable insights and pointers that bring us one step closer to our ultimate destination and happiness.

When we break down a long and arduous task into ... let's say... 42 smaller challenges... we can overcome each one with the feeling of 42 grand accomplishments. Each is a necessity that enabled the ultimate success.

We merely need not give up. Stop, spot the problem and deal with it and then move on! Even 42 times!

### **August 2025 Presidents' Report**

What is a Congregation? For some, it is ability to coordinate social action. For others, it is the support of Israel and the Jewish State. For almost 120 years we have offered a "middle road," adapting Jewish ritual practice to our American society. It is hearing the constant week-to-week repetition of our laws and customs that links us together as a community.

Last month you received a survey with your dues invoice. The overwhelming majority of responses want New Light to continue as a vibrant, Conservative congregation led by Rabbi Jonathan Perlman. Members are not interested in merging with another congregation (though there was a clear preference as to a merger partner). To ensure our long term success a Strategic Planning Committee has been formed and held its first meeting in late July. A report of the Committee will be announced during our High Holiday services in late September.

Many factors impact our long term viability. In addition to finances, the most important are our ability to:

- Maintain our membership,
- Have a minyan in our weekly Shabbat service,
- · Conduct meaningful High Holiday services, and
- Offer insightful adult religious education classes.

We are happy to note that we continue to gain new members (two this month), that we consistently have a minyan, and that our current adult education class has grown in attendance over the last several months. With the assistance of Rabbi Iscah Waldman we look forward to meaningful High Holiday service in Helfant Chapel this September.

On Sunday, September 7<sup>th</sup> we will be holding our Annual Picnic, starting 5:00PM. (rain or shine) This year the picnic is special as we are celebrating Rabbi Perlman's 15<sup>th</sup> year with New Light. Please join us as we honor our Rabbi and all he has done to support our Congregation through the harrowing days following the shooting and through COVID. It has been an eventful 15 years.
